### INSTITUTIONALIZED ISLAMOPHOBIA

- Is a phenomenon whereby officially constructed hate and fear of Muslims are built into structures of the state and society for the pursuit of power and for the justification of war and repression.
- Islamophobia is based on the social construction of Islam as violent, barbaric, uncivilized, and opposed to normative democratic values.
- Islamophobia positions Muslims as existing outside of the moral boundaries extended to other communities such that their dehumanization results in consequences ranging from prejudice and discrimination to detention and even death.
- Islamophobia represents a particular type of oppression that is rooted in anti-religious animus and, based on a Muslim's particular background, intersects with anti-Blackness, racism, cultural racism, nationalism, and xenophobia.



### THE ROLE DOMINANT NATIONAL SECURITY NARRATIVES

- Determine "common-sense givens"
- Govern the boundaries of what can be considered legitimate discourse
- Establish the paramaters of inside and outside actors can publicly justify Ronald R. Krebs, 2015

A wide spectrum of public figures, in and out of office, who are strongly opposed to the policies being pursued abroad by this Administration apparently feel free to say nothing more than that they stand united behind President Bush. "The Terror narrative imparted meaning to the shocking images by supplying a distinctive portrait of the drama's chief protagonists, their motives, and the historical setting. According to that narrative, the meaning of "9/II" – as the day came to be known in the United States – was, and is, clear: on that day, evil terrorists attacked a blameless America because they hate the values Americans hold dear and which America epitomizes; on that day, transnational terrorism showed itself to be the pre-eminent threat to the nation's security; that day marked a turning point in both America's history and global politics."



"The Terror narrative is often seen in the United States as the "natural" interpretation. But that is a sign of the narrative project's relative success, not the day's and events' inherent meaning. The Terror narrative's dominance hid from view that there were other conceivable and plausible narratives, revolving around different portraits of agent, purpose, and scene, and that these alternative narratives were swiftly marginalized after 9/11."

# Exporting the War on Terror Narrative: State Violence from the United States to Israel







"This is an enemy that murders children and mothers in their homes, in their beds. An enemy that kidnaps the elderly, kids, youths. Murderers who massacre and slaughter our citizens, our kids, who just wanted to have fun on the holiday," Netanyahu said. "What happened today has never before seen in Israel, and I will make sure it does not happen again."



"States like these, and their terrorist allies, constitute an axis of evil, arming to threaten the peace of the world. By seeking weapons of mass destruction, these regimes pose a grave and growing danger. They could provide these arms to terrorists, giving them the means to match their hatred. They could attack our allies or attempt to blackmail the United States. In any of these cases, the price of indifference would be catastrophic."



"This is a part of an axis of evil of Iran and Hezbollah and Hamas. Their goal, open goal is to eradicate the State of Israel. The open goal of Hamas is to kill as many Jews as they could and the only difference is, they would have killed every last one of us, murdered every last one of us if they could. They just don't have the capacity but they murdered an extraordinary 1300 civilians which in American terms is like many, many, many 9/11s."





# Anti-Palestinian Racism in Policy

Government

Defenceless villages are bombarded from the air, the inhabitants driven out into the countryside, the cattle machine-gunned, the huts set on fire with incendiary bullets: this is called pacification. Millions of peasants are robbed of their farms and sent trudging along the roads with no more than they can carry: this is called transfer of population or rectification of frontiers. People are imprisoned for years without trial, or shot in the back of the neck or sent to die of scurvy in Arctic lumber camps: this is called elimination of unreliable elements. Such phraseology is needed if one wants to name things without calling up mental pictures of them.

# Working definition of antisemitism

The Jerusalem Declaration on Antisemitism

- Seven of the II examples deal with Israel and Zionism, not with Jews
- The vagueness of the definition allows for weaponization
- No mention of white nationalist jeiwsh hate

- Perpetuates the link between anti-Semitism and Israel, starting with including "Jerusalem"
- "Denying the right of Jews in the State of Israel to exist and flourish, collectively and individually, as Jews, in accordance with the principle of equality."

Commissioner Nash said I would like to make a statement regarding Resolution No. 22. A student-organized walkout in support of a ceasefire between Hamas and Israel at Eastern Regional High School was postponed after a blistering letter from two Camden County Commissioners was sent to the superintendent of the South Jersey district.

"My biggest issue is that it's happening over the Jewish holiday of Passover," Ravitz said on a phone call Tuesday night. "If Jewish students were planning a walkout on any other religious holiday, I would stop it."



### **ABOUT DEADLY EXCHANGE**



One of the most dangerous places where state violence in the U.S. and Israel converge is in exchange programs that bring together police, ICE, border patrol, and FBI from the US with soldiers, police, border agents, etc. from Israel. In these programs, "worst practices" are shared to promote and extend discriminatory and repressive policing in both countries. These include racial profiling, massive spying and surveillance, deportation and detention, and attacks on human rights defenders.

#### Protests on campus and the response

In her testimony, Dr. Shafik said the school is committed to allowing free speech on campus, even designating certain areas for protests, so other students can avoid demonstrations and teaching isn't disrupted. She also said the university has taken drastic steps to ensure safety for all students.

"Our actions included support for students, enhanced reporting channels for incidents, hiring additional staff to investigate complaints, developing new policies on demonstrations, holding listening forums to model respectful behaviors, launching educational programs, and forming a task force of our senior leaders to propose solutions to antisemitism," she said.

- An engaged bystander
- A vocal bystander
- A co-conspirator: Joins organizing efforts to dismantle anti-Palestinian racism

### Engaged Bystander

#### See something wrong and will quietly intervene:

- Write letters to biased newspapers articles
- Calling your representative about concern
- Talking to school about a policy
- Reaching out to your connections to see if they can make something good happen
- Talking to someone in private about their behaviors
- Being a support system for an organizer or person who is working to dismantle anti-Palestinian racism including being a buddy and calling them before they go places, or walking them to their car or dorm, etc.

#### Vocal Bystander

See something wrong and will intervene publically:

- Speaking up in class, meetings, work places,
- Writing a public letter in a paper about how you feel about the need for Palestinian liberation and human rights
- Speaking at schoolboard, city council or legislature meetings
- Demanding publicly for policy for Palestinian liberation and right to organize
- Hold politicians and leaders accountable for their actions or inactions

#### Co-Conspirator: Organizing


Joining organizing efforts (powerful show of power):






